COMMISSION COMMENTS:

Commissioner Blackburn, recently retired from FEMA, spoke about flood risk in some parts of Pacifica. He referenced the City equalization basin project that was specifically undertaken to reduce flood risk in the community. He also encouraged community

members to research their flood insurance rating under the recently updated FEMA flood risk rating system.

Commissioner Salisbury inquired about FEMA provided fire insurance. Commissioner Blackburn replied FEMA does not provide fire insurance. Fire insurance information may be found on the Wildfire Preparedness page on the City website, cityofpacifica.org.

Commissioner Lotridge announced he will be resigning from the commission next year, prior to the end of his term, because he will be relocating.

Commissioner Salisbury promoted COVID-19 testing being offered at Seton Medical Center, 1850 Sullivan Ave, in Daly City, from 7:30 a.m.-2:30 p.m., Monday-Friday. Those interested may register online, however walk ups are also welcome. Results are typically available within 24-48 hours. No medical insurance is required.

Commissioner Johnson spoke about the planned COVID-19 vaccination clinic that was recently announced will be located at the San Mateo County Event Center. Additional information on COVID vaccine clinics may be found at the smchealth.org website.

Commissioners shared their thoughts on measures such as requiring face coverings, requiring proof of vaccination, their health concerns about in person meetings, and the value of in person meetings. They also wanted to know what safety measures were being considered by City Council in order to return to in person meetings. Council member Bigstyck shared that these measures were still being discussed.

Commissioners discussed increasing the reach of promoting the CERT Earthquake Preparedness Class presented recently by Commissioner Hitz in a virtual format. Several commissioners provided useful suggestions.

The Commission Chair and all Commissioners recognized and expressed their appreciation to Commissioner Breck Hitz for his service during his term. Commissioner Hitz shared he intendeds to continue to serve the community in his role as the volunteer coordinator with the Pacifica CERT program.
