RESOLUTION NO. 110-2023

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PACIFICA SUPPORTING THE HIGHWAY 1 / MANOR DRIVE OVERCROSSING IMPROVEMENT PROJECT AND AUTHORIZING SUBMITTAL OF AN APPLICATION FOR MEASURE A AND MEASURE W HIGHWAY PROGRAM FUNDING

- WHEREAS, Manor Drive Overcrossing does not meet current road, bicycle and pedestrian facility standard as well as structural and seismic standards; and
- WHEREAS, Manor Overcrossing Improvement component will widen the overcrossing structure, flare the curb returns and install traffic signals at the intersections and provide for safer bicycle and pedestrian facility and further study a freeway on-ramp for northbound Highway 1 at Milagra Drive and Oceana Boulevard, utilizing an existing bus pull-out ramp that is no longer in use; and
- **WHEREAS,** it will cost \$4,000,000 to implement the Plans, Specifications, and Estimates project scope; and
- WHEREAS, the City of Pacifica wishes to sponsor the Plans, Specifications, and Estimates; and
- **WHEREAS**, the City currently seeks \$3,600,000 in funding for the Plans, Specifications, and Estimates; and
- WHEREAS, on June 7, 1988, the voters of San Mateo County approved a ballot measure to allow the collection and distribution by the San Mateo County Transportation Authority (TA) of a half-cent transactions and use tax in San Mateo County for 25 years, with the tax revenues to be used for highway and transit improvements pursuant to the Transportation Expenditure Plan presented to the voters (Original Measure A); and
- WHEREAS, on November 2, 2004, the voters of San Mateo County approved the continuation of the collection and distribution by the TA of the half-cent transactions and use tax for an additional 25 years to implement the 2004 Transportation Expenditure Plan beginning January 1, 2009 (New Measure A); and
- WHEREAS, on November 6, 2018, the voters of San Mateo County approved a ballot measure known as "Measure W," which increased the sales tax in San Mateo County by 1/2 percent, and tasked the TA with administering four of the five transportation program categories pursuant to the Congestion Relief Plan presented to the voters; and
- **WHEREAS,** the TA issued a Call for Projects for the Measure A and Measure W Highway Program funds on July 5, 2023; and
- **WHEREAS**, the TA requires applicants for Measure A and/or Measure W funds to submit a resolution in support of the application, in this case for \$3,600,000 in Measure A Highway Program funds for Plans, Specifications, and Estimates; and
- WHEREAS, the TA also requires applicants to submit a resolution committing to the completion of the proposed project scope, in this case Plans, Specifications, and Estimates; and

WHEREAS, if the TA Board awards Measure A and/or Measure W Highway Program funds to the Plans, Specifications, and Estimates the TA will require that the City of Pacifica commence work on the Plans, Specifications, and Estimates within one year of TA Board action.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council of the City of Pacifica,

- 1. Directs staff to submit an application for TA Measure A and Measure W Highway Program funds for \$3,600,000 for the Plans, Specifications, and Estimates.
- Authorizes the City Manager to execute a funding agreement with the San Mateo County Transportation Authority for the City of Pacifica to receive any Measure A and/or Measure W Highway Program funds awarded.
- Commits \$400,000 in City of Pacifica matching funds for the completion of Plans, Specifications, and Estimates, if awarded the requested TA Measure A and Measure W Highway Program funds.
- 4. Directs the City of Pacifica to commence work on Plans, Specifications, and Estimates within one year of receiving an award of Measure A and Measure W Highway Program Funds.
