Project Location & Extents

- Located in northern Pacifica, on the western edge of the historic West Sharp Park neighborhood.
- Assessing the entire span of the current infrastructure and seawall, including:
 - North Wall
 - Pier Wall System
 - South Wall
 - South Gap





Beach Boulevard Infrastructure Resiliency Project

Project Goals:

- Replace the current seawall and outdated infrastructure
- Build climate resilience into one of the most vulnerable segments of the City's shoreline.
- Improve public access and use of the Beach Boulevard Promenade.
- Create a multi-benefit solution to protect public infrastructure, recreational activities, homes, businesses, and the community at large, from further coastal erosion impacts.

Hybrid Alternative






Phase 1 Recommendation

Phase 2A


- Focus: Preliminary Design of Hybrid Alternative
- Deliverables and Tasks:
 - 35% Design of infrastructure improvements, Promenade features and amenities
 - CEQA: Project Description, Notice of Preparation, and Notice of Completion
 - Community and Stakeholder Engagement Program
- Council approved scope and budget 11/28/2022



Engineering Design Focus

Preliminary design (35% plans) components to be informed by technical analyses and input from regulatory agencies:

- Seawall (height, alignment, & type)
- Rock Scour Apron (rock size & dimensions)
- Natural Shoreline Infrastructure (placement location, quantity and frequency)

Open House Key Themes

BBIRP Overview

- Placement, composition, and height of wall and what informs those decisions
- Responsibilities/decision making authority between City and CA Coastal Commission (CCC)
- Project costs

Phase 1 Recap

- Managing CCC concerns
- Project lifespan/cost
- Logistics of beach nourishment/sand allocation
- Where funding is/will be coming from



Open House Key Themes

Phase 2A/Share Your Feedback

- Add continuous bike path along Beach Blvd.
- Balancing property protection with beach/habitat health and access
- Lots of ideas for improving the promenade area seating, gathering space, restrooms, dog walking areas/amenities,
- Storm drains need to be better maintained and/or replaced
- Lots of comments about parking to maintain it, require payment for parking
- Other comments about not allowing cars at all!
