FY 2019-20 Citywide Slurry Seal Project

PACIFICA, CA - The FY 2019-20 Citywide Slurry Seal Project will rehabilitate the pavement along Terra Nova Boulevard from Fassler Avenue to Oddstad Boulevard; Oddstad Boulevard from Terra Nova Boulevard to North end; and Peralta Road from Crespi Drive to Linda Mar Boulevard. Impacted residents have been notified and will be notified again a week prior to the slurry seal work.

The Slurry Seal Project will consist of two main phases:

The first phase will be the filling of street cracks prior to the slurry seal application. It will ensure an even finish is attained and will be manually applied. The second phase is the slurry seal, which is an asphalt mix application applied over the existing street pavement. The slurry seal is comprised of a latex emulsified asphalt that would take 4-6 hours to cure on the street. Slurry seal allows the pavement to be sealed from water intrusion, which can cause deterioration of the street. When it cures it provides better traction and a wearing surface for automobile traffic. Days after the slurry seal has been applied, the traffic striping will be installed, which will include the installation of bicycle lanes.

The project is slated to begin on **September 3, 2020 and will continue through October 2 weather permitting**. Loud construction noises should be expected along with the presence of heavy-duty equipment. There will be periods in the daytime when traffic will be rerouted to avoid conflicts with construction, so vehicular movements through the area will be slower than what is normally experienced. Parking will also be restricted within the project's limits of work on Monday through Friday from 8:30 am to 5 pm. Motorists are advised to plan accordingly due to traffic delays.

The City has deemed this as an essential construction project as defined by the San Mateo County Shelter In Place Order as it is a public works infrastructure safety project.
