

CITY OF PACIFICA BEAUTIFICATION ADVISORY COMMITTEE MEETING MINUTES

Wednesday, August 5, 2020 Virtual Meeting via Zoom

CALL TO ORDER: 6:33 P.M. by Chairperson Melinda Moses

APPROVAL OF AGENDA: Approved.

APPROVAL OF July 1, 2020 Minutes: Approved.

PUBLIC COMMENT: No members of the public present

DISCUSSION ITEMS:

- **A. Existing Agreements/Areas of Adoptions:** Gail reported the areas look good overall, but she noticed there are some plants present that they did not plant. Gail first wanted to gather volunteers to add fresh mulch, weed, and plant lavender, and then contact the sponsors about their sites. Dave reminded the Committee that the sponsors agreed to upkeep the area when they signed the agreement, so volunteers should not be necessary. Dave also shared that the best time to plant is October to November and that mulch is available for sponsors to take at the open yard from 8 am.-4:30 p.m. during the week. Gail will communicate a maintenance work plan and due date to the sponsors.
- **B.** Mayor's Beautification Awards: No new updates at this time. The members will meet the week of August 10 to discuss.
- C. Community Center southwest side planter: Melinda will measure the planter box at the Community Center to see how to divide the sections up for future adoptions. Melinda also asked for ideas on how to pay for additional Adopt-A-Spot signs. Councilmember Sue Beckmeyer stated her understanding was that the City department who the committee is connected to absorbs the costs of the committee's projects. Sue also shared that as of right now, the Economic Development Committee is the only Committee that has a budget because they presented a work plan and budget request to the Council. Melinda decided the committee should start the same process.

Memorial benches and plaques were also discussed. At this time, there are no locations available, and Public Works is still addressing the replacement of the stolen plaques. Melinda asked Lawrence about the number of utility boxes owned by the City because the BAC received a public art inquiry. Lawrence stated some are owned by Caltrans, and believes the city owns 5-6 traffic signal boxes. Aren will look into locations to make sure the City is sole owners of the boxes and report back.

D. Mural Sub-committee update to Falk project: No new updates at this time until the committee is able to meet and discuss a work plan.
